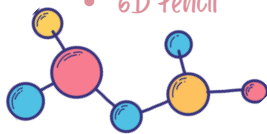


Wish List

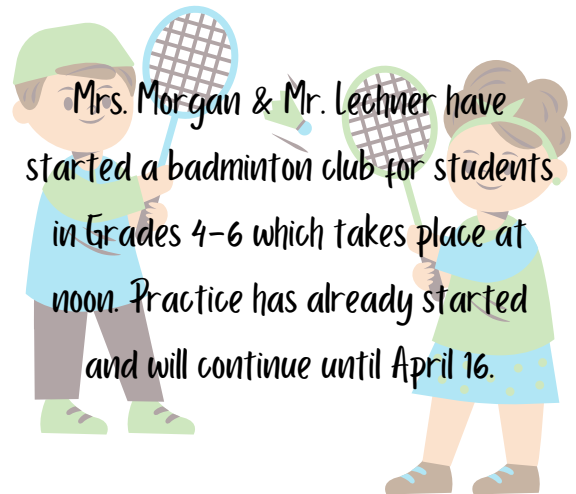

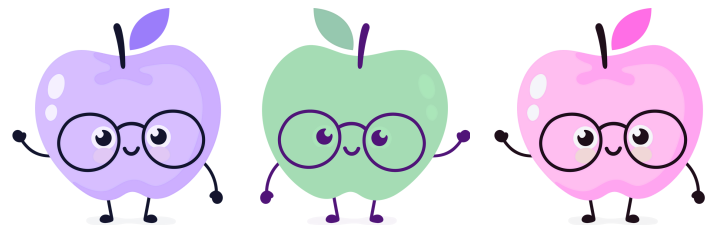
